

Minutes of the regular monthly meeting of the Town of Leola Board of Supervisors held on Sept. 19, 2007:

Meeting was **called to order** by Chairman Ken Zimbeck at 6:00 p.m. All Board members, Clerk, and Treasurer were present. Gene Mucciolo, Sheriff Darrell Renner, Karl Klingforth, Dave Repinski, Judie Pospichal, and approximately seven others were also present.

Motion by Ted/Orin to **approve the minutes** of the August 15, 2007 meeting as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer gave a report showing a balance in all funds of \$101,604.87. Motion by Orin/Ted to accept this report. Motion carried.

New business:

1. Presentation by Gene Mucciolo on services to develop and maintain a website for Town: Presentation included scope of services, cost, and background of provider. Discussion will continue at October meeting.
2. Question/answer interview with Adams County Sheriff Darrell Renner on effectiveness of his department: Sheriff Renner explained personnel shortages in the department which have resulted in decreased services available to the public. Sheriff agreed to personally investigate the dog-bite incident, especially the lack of reports available to the district attorney and Town Board members in pursuing the disposition of the dog in question.
3. Discuss, with possible action, applying for culvert aid from Adams County Hwy. Dept. for culvert on 6th Avenue at Apache Avenue: Motion by Orin/Ted to submit the petition for aid. Motion carried.
4. Discuss, with possible action, Town participation in the LUCD program, 2010 Census: Discussion was inconclusive and will be continued in October.
5. Discuss, with possible action, NIMS compliance requirements for an Emergency Operations Plan: Several minor changes were made. Motion by Ted/Orin to accept the plan as amended. Motion carried.
6. Discuss need for an ordinance to control and restrict nuisance junk: Motion by Orin/Ted to table until October meeting. Motion carried.
7. Set meeting dates for 4th quarter: October 17, regular meeting, including budget preparation if agenda is not too involved, otherwise set another date for a special meeting to prepare budget; November 14, Budget Hearing, Town Meeting, and regular Board meeting; December 12, regular meeting; October will be clean-up month.
8. Identify items for future consideration: As already identified and need for road inspection.

Old business: None

Other reports:

1. Update by Chairman on dog-bite complaint: Covered during Sheriff's interview.
2. Clerk's report on registering for election training for clerk, deputy clerk, and chief inspector: Registrations have been made for training sessions, and deputy clerk will train two new inspectors after he has received his training and before February 19, 2008.

3. Ken reported that anyone interested in taking training to be a local coordinator for the gypsy moth program should contact him.

Correspondence: Request by Adams County Hwy. Dept. for salt/sand order (possible action): Clerk was directed to order based on last year's use.

Citizen's input: Joe Russo had questions about property assessments and possible increases in property taxes and Tom Whalen asked if the Board would reconsider opening Aspen Drive to ATV traffic.

Motion by Orin/Ted to **pay bills** by checks 4045 through 4058 as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by Ted/Orin to **adjourn** at 8:55 p.m. Motion carried.
